OH HAPPY DAY


The day cream

Winner: Natura Bissé Winn

Natura Bissé C+C Vitamin
Cream, £90, is like a big glass
of Berocca for skin: a citrusy
cocktail of antioxidants that pep
up, reboot and hydrate by the
bucketful. And how cheery is

Highly commended: Giorgio Armani

And Giorgio Armani Crema Nera, £310, with its pearl-like sheen, is thick and rich and unbelievably decadent. Save for big days.



The serum

Winner: Guerlain

There's something about *Guerlain Abeille Royale Daily Repair Serum*, from £90 – a silky solution swimming with tiny balls of encapsulated royal jelly and other anti-ageing wonders – that just makes skin feel better: smoother, softer and, above all, healthier. Those are some clever, clever bees!

Highly commended: Tata Harper

The all-natural, anti-inflammatory *Tata Harper Replenishing Nutrient Complex*, £36, is a serum – but in ROLLERBALL form. Which means that not only is skin happier when it's got it on, but applying the stuff is fabulous fun too.

Highly commended: Santaverde

Santaverde Age Protect Boost, £38, comes in tiny glass ampoules that snap open, spilling forth a jelly-like mixture of aloe vera and hyaluronic acid. Just the ticket for skin that's feeling a bit sorry for itself.



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EYE, EYE!

The eye cream Winner: Fresh

An entry-level eye cream, but a good 'un nonetheless. Fresh Rose Hydrating Eye Gel Cream, £33, is pleasingly lightweight, cooling and marvellously de-puffing, which makes it excellent arsenal when you're hungover.

Highly commended: Crème de la Mer

On the flipside, Crème de la Mer The Illuminating Eye Gel, £100, is a stonker of a product. Packed with their heroic Miracle Broth formula, it leaves eyes looking tighter and brighter – and crow's feet noticeably lighter.



DON'T SLIP UP

The face oil

Winner: Amanda Lacey Amanda Lacey's Oils of Provence, £98, might be the closest you'll get to a facial with the woman herself. But its soothing, sagey properties, plus its ability to perk up even the most forlorn skin, mean that, actually, that's OK.

Highly commended: Sunday Riley

And thanks to the lightweight, dry-oil formula of *Sunday Riley Juno Hydroactive Cellular Face Oil*, £98, even shiny faces can get in on the act.

The everything-else cream

Winner: Elizabeth Arden Prevage

The does-it-all-range Winner: Diptyque
